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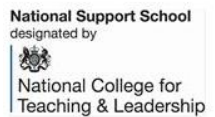



Phonics/ Spelling	<p>We are learning to consolidate our knowledge of blending.</p> <p>Phase 4</p>	<p>This week we are consolidating our knowledge of Phase 4 blends and clusters. These help us to read even more words.</p> <p>Phonics Play https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/ (username: march20 password: home). https://www.phonicsbloom.com/uk/game/list/phonics-games-phase-4</p> <p><i>belt</i> <i>spade</i> <i>dolphin</i></p> <p><i>Sounds buttons.</i> <i>Each sound (grapheme) will have a button.</i> <i>Single sounds (phonemes) have a dot, like b and e.</i> <i>Two letters together that make one sound (a diagraph), like ph and sh have a line underneath.</i> <i>Remember that the Phase 4 blends like sp are still two sounds (phonemes) blending. They are not diagraphs. So they have dots underneath them not lines.</i></p>	<p>Activity One: Phonics games : Use the two links to the websites to play some games to reinforce Phase 4 blends. Go on to the Phonicsplay website, click on Phase 4 games, click on Flash card time challenge. Have a couple of tries – How is your speed? Can you get faster? On Phonics Bloom, click on the link and have a try of Alien Escape or Word Pairs. Have fun!</p> <p>Activity Two: Read through the Phase 4 work sheet sounding out each word. Can you write the sound buttons for each word? Choose 3 of the words and write a sentence using each.</p> <p>Activity Three: Choose one of the Phase 4 Phonics activity mats to complete. We have saved two of them but you don’t need to do them both if you don’t want to. Good Luck!</p>

See the template- you can print, if you are able to.</p> <p>Activity 2: For Traction Man’s first adventure, he saves the farm animals from the Evil Pillows! Look at the pictures on page two. Pretend to be Traction Man and retell this adventure from his point of view using the story frame.</p> <p>Activity 3: Traction Man’s Rocket Boots help save the day! Can you draw and label a pair of your own Super Power Boots? They can be like the ones in the story or completely different. In your drawing show what they can do!</p>
