Staff News

Teacher-Parent Communication

We are mindful that parents' contact with their child's teacher is restricted at the moment and we are currently devising processes to ensure any essential meetings can take place, as we are unable to hold meetings just yet. To support the home-school relationship, over the next two weeks, teachers will be making short phone calls home to speak to parents to introduce themselves. This will also be an opportunity for parents to share any key messages with their child/ren's class teachers. Whilst during the summer term we were able to give parents a date the phone calls home would take place, we are unable to do this for these phone calls as teachers will be finding pockets of time when they aren't teaching to call. If you miss the call, please don't worry, they will try again at another time. Before these calls take place, parents will be sent information about the curriculum for the Autumn Term which may answer some of the questions you have. If anyone has misplaced their child's log in details you can find them on our website in the Summer 2020 learning section. Home Learning will also be set from the week beginning 14th September. Initially, this will be uploaded to the website but we are looking at other methods of sharing home learning electronically with parents.

Maths Updates

Saxon Maths Website updated – Mrs Hartshorn has been very busy during the summer holidays updating the Saxon Maths website https://saxonmaths.weebly.com/ with lots of new content. There are lots of new resources, website links, games and songs and videos on each key stage page, so do spend some time with your child and explore the new things that are on there. A reminder that there is also a parent page with useful information, including the Saxon Progression in Calculations documents for each year group, which show how we teach addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. There are some new 'How to...' videos as well.

Times Table Rockstars – A reminder that all children in KS2 have logins for Times Table Rockstars https://ttrockstars.com/ A parent information letter about Times Table Rockstars is on the parent page of the Saxon Maths website in the 'other downloads' section. The children in 2P and 2DM will have been introduced to the website today and parents should have received usernames and passwords via the learning account email. Bikes & Scooters


Children are still able to ride or scoot to school if they wish and use our bike racks to store their bike/scooter during the school day. Children will be asked to walk their bike or scooter through the playgrounds to the bike racks and then will take themselves to class.

If parents wish to provide sweets for the class they can, and to do this safely we ask that the sweets are individually wrapped and in a bag that is sealed (from when it is purchased).
