



COVID-19 Update

Parents will be aware from the information sent this morning that we have closed a class due to a confirmed case of COVID-19. Please ensure you have read that letter carefully. We are aware, as there often is, that speculation and mis-information on Whatsapp groups is fueling parents' concerns and worries; this causes unnecessary alarm and panic. Children and staff will be absent from school for all sorts of reasons and we ask parents to trust the communication from the school; where absence is related to Coronavirus we will tell you if it affects your child/ren.

In addition, it was announced yesterday that the borough of Elmbridge will move into Tier 2 of the Government's new three-tier system for England, meaning they are now deemed an area of HIGH risk. The change will be implemented from 00:01hrs on Sunday 18th October. The new restrictions for Elmbridge Borough will include:

- no socialising with people you don't live with, or who aren't in your support bubble, in any indoor setting
- the rule of 6 still applies outdoors, including private gardens, beaches or parks

This is in addition to national restrictions already in place on wearing face coverings, social distancing, and working from home when possible. If you can't work from home you should walk or cycle where possible, or try to avoid busy times on public transport. Children should still attend school unless they present with symptoms or otherwise unwell.

Social Distancing on School Grounds

Drop off: From Monday, parents will be asked to form a queue from 8:30am around the path outside the front gate to support the children in keeping their distance from each other when coming through the gate.

Pick up: Please can we remind parents to remember to queue and remain socially distanced from other parents when collecting their child at the front gate? It is particularly helpful if parents do not arrive earlier than their allotted collection time to reduce waiting time and congestion at the entrance to school.

We kindly ask parents who wish to speak to the member of staff on either gate to maintain a 2m distance. Currently, whilst it is not mandatory to wear a mask outside, it is parental choice should you choose to wear a face covering during drop off and pick up times.

Harvest Festival

Very well done to our Year 5 classes who performed their Harvest celebration to us on Wednesday! Alternative Collection Arrangements

Please make sure any adult collecting your child is aware of their time and pick up point and also ensure the office are made aware of the change.

Family Centre – new contact number


