Dear Saxon families,

Last week the children enjoyed listening to Elmer and other related stories. They also liked discussing what makes them unique and special. The children were introduced to adjectives when they explored the different ways to describe the elephants. In Maths the children enjoyed learning about more and less especially when they compared objects in the classroom.

Reading Books

Please continue to read at home and record your reading sessions in the green Reading Record. We encourage you to explore a book daily with your child (approximately 10-15 minutes per day is perfect at this stage). It is important that the children are exposed to the same text repeatedly to develop their understanding. As mentioned before, the children will not be able to read the books at this point but we encourage you to focus on ensuring that children are confident in identifying the title, turning the pages independently and are able to draw upon picture clues to support them in storytelling. If you are enthusiastic about a book, they will be too!

Please remember to leave your child's reading books in their bags.

Learning:

Our topic for this term is 'All About Me'

Our topics are highly influenced by the children's interests therefore activities may change from those planned.

This week in Reception, we will be introducing the following as part of our focused learning:

Communication, Language & Literacy:

- This week we will focus on the story The Gruffalo by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler
- We will visit the forest school and begin to explore some of the language used in the story
- We will make story predictions and discuss the key themes in the story
- We will continue to practice our names and use initial sounds in our writing.

Key vocabulary – friendship, kindness, woodland, stroll, poisonous, astounding, animals

Maths:

- We are learning to count and say numbers in sequence.

Key vocabulary: counting, one to one correspondence, sequence, more, less.

Stem sentences used in class:

'Let's count on from 0'

'What is the same...what is different?'

'What number comes after 2, how do you know?'

'There are 10 altogether, how do we know?
