Since our Warm Welcome venues opened their doors in November 2023, over 11,000 Surrey residents have attended sessions, getting a free hot drink, energy advice, winter essential items and much more. Many venues offer additional services such as free hot meals, debt and employment advice, as well as social activities. These include board game and arts and crafts sessions, cooking classes and in one case, a children's entertainer attends so children can run around after school while their parents relax and have an opportunity to speak to our volunteers.

Your View Matters! Have your say on the River Thames Scheme

On 15 January, the River Thames Scheme (RTS) launched a communications campaign called Your View Matters to support the launch of its Statutory Consultation.

Statutory Consultation is a six-week period where in-person and virtual events take place from 00:00 on Monday 22 January 2024 to 23:59 on Monday 4 March. The scheme uses this period, to formally consult with local communities and key stakeholders, to ensure the final project design is informed and influenced by those who live, work, and use the area. We are keen to ensure all those who have an interest in sharing their views on the final design for the RTS, know where, when and how to take part.

The RTS is an integrated scheme, working in partnership between Surrey County Council and the Environment Agency. It aims at reducing the risk of flooding to homes, businesses and infrastructure, in addition to improving access to quality green and open space, creating a more sustainable travel network and increasing biodiversity.


Reading




