Attendance

Good attendance in school is vital. Not only for children to make academic progress but for their mental health and well-being too; children need to interact with peers their age and be sociable. There are certain illnesses which do require time off school such as chicken pox or vomiting, however, with most mild illnesses, children are able to come to school if they are well enough. Holidays in term time will **not** be authorised. In exceptional circumstances, a few days leave may be granted and an Exceptional Leave of Absence form must be completed at least 10 days in advance of the date the absence is due to begin. This form can be found here:

Exceptional leave includes religious ceremonies, weddings and funerals, amongst other key events that may happen. All requests will be considered on a case by case basis and take into account children's current and previous year's attendance, and whether similar requests have been granted previously. Proof of an appointment or wedding for example, may be required.

Just to remind families that if you take your child/ren out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), you will be liable to receive a penalty notice.

Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local

Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

Changes to Medical/Dietary Requirements

Should your child have specific medical or dietary requirements and there is a change to their diagnosis or treatment at any point in the year, it is your responsibility to inform school of this. Please keep us up to date in order for us to keep your child safe in school. Thank you.

Important information regarding payment options

Families can continue to book using credit/debit card and childcare vouchers. We are also part of the Spelthorne Playscheme again this year. Childcare voucher and Tax Free Childcare payments need to be paid to Summer Camp (via your child's school) within 14 days of a Camp booking being made otherwise your booking will be automatically cancelled and the sessions released and made available to other families.

For those families who have booked in previous years your portal account will remain live and ready for use. Kindness Challenge

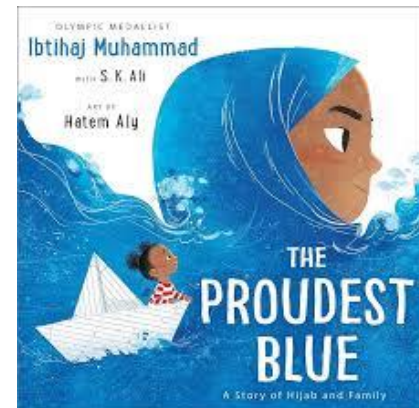
Well done to Sam (2B) & Eilidh (2DM) who completed all of the kindness activities on their bingo cards over the holidays!
